WHEREAS, in addition to his Park Board service, Mr. Clampitt also served on the Traffic and Safety Commission, Comprehensive Plan Steering Committee and the Citizens Advisory Committee for Housing and Urban Development; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Clampitt took great pride in the continued improvement of Midwest City's parks and recreational facilities and was especially proud of the development of the Regional Park Dog Park, a project that reflects the City's commitment to providing quality amenities for its residents and visitors; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Clampitt's dedication and volunteer service have helped advance Midwest City's vision of providing exceptional parks, facilities, and programs for the community;

THEREFORE, I, Richard R. Rice, Mayor of the City Midwest City, Oklahoma, do hereby proclaim July 20, 2026, as:

Midwest City Parks, Recreation, and Trails Master Plan

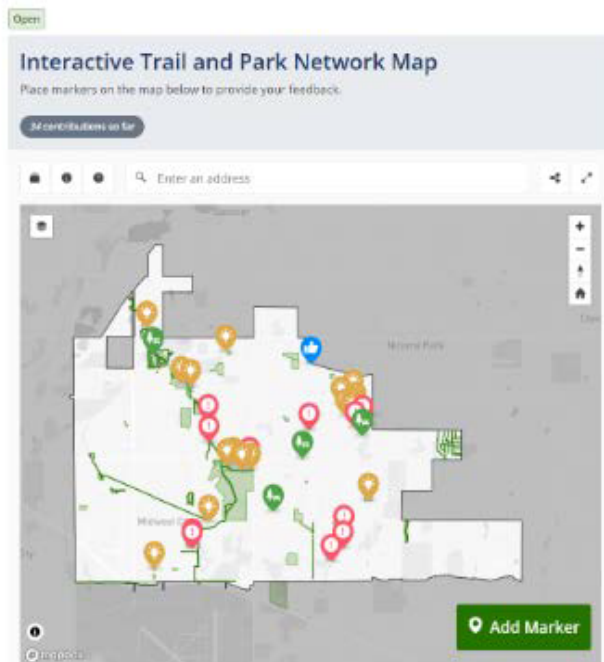
